This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

- Our school follows a two-year rolling programme for music which is provided by Charanga
- Our teaching is inspired by the Model Music Curriculum (2021)
- SEND children have access to lessons within whole class teaching and throughout our nurture curriculum
- The recommended one hour per week is allocated to a 30-minute whole school singing assembly and a 30 minute in class lesson taught by the class teacher
- We are partnered with the Lincolnshire Music Hub who provide
- Across the school, children have the opportunity to develop their singing skills and play a variety of instruments including glockenspiel and recorder.
- In Year 3, we take part in Samba drumming during the Summer 2 term, provided by Lincolnshire Music service

Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

- We have a school choir which runs once a week during lunchtime and is free to join (these then work towards the young voices concert and Boston's Got Talent)
- Lincolnshire Music Service offer the opportunity for the children to learn to play an instrument (paid for by parents with discounts for LAC, PLAC and those entitled to FSM)
- Our Year 3 classes have the opportunity to participate in a block of Samba drumming lessons taught by Lincolnshire Music service
- Every week we hold whole school singing assemblies
- We collaborate with 'The Biz' a local theatre group to put on a pantomime for members of the local community

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

- Following the Samba drumming lessons, our Year 3 children perform a piece in assembly
- Our Year 6 children participate in an end of year performance (every year)
- All of Key Stage 2 perform at a Christmas carol concert held at our local church (every year)
- Our Reception and Year 1 children take part in the Christmas nativity (every year)
- Our Year 6 children attend The Church Schools festival at Lincoln Cathedral
- This year we will be singing at the Boston Stump Christmas light switch on
- Our school choir attend and perform at the Young Voices concert, where they also get to see live performances from a range of styles of music (every year)

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- We are in the process of reviewing and adapting our current music curriculum so that it can be taught consistently each week across all year groups with

greater confidence and range of instrument and skill, in line with 'The Model Music Curriculum'

- We will develop termly performances to ensure that all year groups have the opportunity to showcase what they have been learning
- Our children will have the opportunity to access music lessons provided by Lincolnshire Music service
- Children will see at least one live music performance each academic year
