
Home School Agreement

- * Provide a positive and safe learning environment
- * Encourage your child to work hard and do their best
- Encourage responsible and respectful behaviour towards others and their environment
- * Encourage and promote your child's independence
- * Provide information regarding your child's curriculum
- * Assess your child regularly and plan new learning
- Inform you of your child's progress at regular meetings and through written reports
- Show respect for children and parents and the concerns they may have
- Inform you of any concerns we have related to your child and be available, by prior appointment, to discuss any concerns that you may have
- Teach positive attitudes to one another regardless of gender, race, culture, belief, age and need
- * Be happy to welcome members of the community if you would like to contribute to our broader curriculum (we recognise that the local community holds a wealth of talent, expertise, diversity and enthusiasm that could benefit our children)

Parents will:

- * Promote my child's learning at school and at home
- Support the school's high standards of behaviour in line with the school rules and discipline policy
- * Promote my child's growing responsibility and independence
- * Ensure that my child attends school regularly by endeavouring to book holidays and appointments outside of school terms where possible and letting the school know of the reasons for absence
- ❖ Ensure that my child arrives at school on time (between 8.30a.m and 8.50a.m)
- * Make arrangements for my child's safe return home at the appropriate time (3.10p.m for KS1, 3.15p.m for KS2, checking the finishing times of clubs)
- * Park courteously outside the school, respect the school safety zone and follow the car park rules (no parking in the staff car park)
- * Attend consultations to discuss my child's learning and progress
- Let the school know of any concerns that may be affecting your child's learning
- * Not abuse the use of social media

- Demonstrate a positive attitude towards school and respect the adults working there
- Ensure that my child is suitably equipped and dressed for school each day (including appropriate PE kit)
- Support the school by encouraging my child to develop a positive attitude towards our diverse and multi-cultural community

- * Be responsible for their own actions
