<u>Reading</u>


Get hooked in a book and read for a minimum of 20 minutes a day.

Topic - Kings and Queens.

We have been looking at kings and queens, focusing on George V and Elizabeth II. Your tasks are to:

- Make a poster about George V or Elizabeth II.
- Research another king or queen of your choice and make a fact file.
- Make a model of a palace or a castle. This could be real or imaginary. See if you can make a working drawbridge or portcullis.

Our current science topics are the seasons and weather. Please complete the following tasks:

- Choose your favourite season. Draw or paint a picture about your season and say why it is your favourite.
- Keep a weather diary using the sheet which has already been sent home. You can record your ideas by ticking and crossing the boxes or you can write about the weather in the boxes. Do not worry about the temperature part, you can just write whether it is hot or cold.
