PE and Sport Premium Offer 2015/2016

Government - Primary School Sports Funding

The £150 million per annum of funding for primary school sport has now been secured until 2020 by the current Government. This funding has been jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all of their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Eligible schools

All schools with seventeen or more primary-aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £500 per pupil.

Purpose of funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work <u>alongside</u> primary teachers when teaching PE
- new or additional Change4Life sport clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE/sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and holiday clubs.

Accountability

Schools will be held to account for how they spend the sport funding. Ofsted has strengthened its coverage of sport and PE within the Inspectors' Handbook and supporting guidance, so that schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed.

Schools will be required to include details about their sporting provision on their school website, alongside their curriculum details and financial information so parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day. The outcomes are reported in the leadership section of the inspection report.

Best practice

Schools will be able to draw on information on effective practice taken from case studies provided by the very best schools. Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year's expenditure and its impact.

Funding period

Under the current Government the funding will be paid each academic year until 2020.

Greenwood Dale Foundation Trust Coastal Sport Partnership - The Offer

Over the past two years the GDFT Coastal Sport Partnership (through the Skegness Academy) has provided a nationally recognised partnership for sporting provision across the primary sector. Our overarching aim is to make PE consistently high quality across the schools in the partnership as well as providing all children with an exciting insight in to PE and sport that they will carry through to adult life. This year the partnership has facilitated a number of opportunities:

- Three central training days. These have been delivered by some of the country's top trainers for PE.
- Each school identified a training need and received five hours bespoke training.
- Primary staff working alongside secondary PE teachers or high quality coaches.
- Year 5 young leaders training delivered.
- Three partnership newsletters as well as the partnership website to keep children, parents, staff and governors informed.
- Dance festival for year 2/3 children.
- On school site outdoor pursuits day provided by Grouptogether.
- Gifted and talented residential at Butlin's. Children working alongside Academy staff to develop their skills and confidence.

During the last few months we have been working to ensure that our offer for the next academic year continues to provide value for money as well as providing development for staff and high quality PE for all the children.

This will enable primary schools to access a wide range of PE and sporting opportunities, thus supporting them to enhance the quality of PE and sports provision within their school. Furthermore, it will generate a more consistent approach across the East Coast, providing pupils with opportunities regardless of the geographic location of their school.

Each primary school will be asked to contribute £4,500 to receive the following benefits;

- Quality curriculum delivery from the Skegness Academy teachers and quality coaches;
- Staff CPD, delivered by an external provider three days per year;
- Partnership membership to the YST;
- Outdoor pursuits day (Grouptogether) bespoke to your school/needs;
- Year one/two dance festival;
- Primary PE forum;
- Newsletter to keep schools and parents informed;
- Website to keep staff, pupils and parents informed;
- Playmarker training and certification;
- Continued training for secondary staff to specialise at Key Stage 1;
- School Games Kite Mark accreditation support.
- Support to produce an intra-competition structure within schools;
- One year's Membership to 5-a-Day;
- Residential experience for G&T pupils;
- Accountability, keeping schools up to date with Ofsted;
- Procurement of equipment and resources;
