








- They can be written from the top to the bottom of the page, or across the page just as we write.

THE RIVER NILE



We find out information about ancient Egyptian people from the objects that they left behind.
















Ancient	Ancient means that something existed a long time ago in the past, or that it is really old.	Source	and is usually found in the hills or mountains
Egypt	A country in North-East Africa near the Middle East	Minerals	A mineral is a solid chemical compound that occurs naturally in pure form.
BC/AD	BC is 'before Christ' was born. AD comes from the Latin 'Anno Domini' (In the year of Our Lord) and is after Jesus was born	Fertile	Fertile means producing or capable of producing abundant vegetation or crops.
Artefacts	An artefact is an object made by a human being, typically one of historical interest.	Burial	The action or practice of burying a body.
Wealth	Wealth is an abundance of valuable possessions or money or a plentiful supply of a particular desirable thing.	Amulets	An ornament or small piece of jewellery thought to give protection against every danger, or disease

HISTORY TIMELINE


























HOW TO MAKE A MUMMY

Wash the body with palm oil and water from the river.



Next, pull out the brains through the nostrils using a hook. Fill the skull with sawdust or resin.



3 Cut out the internal body organs (except the heart). Put the liver, lungs,



4 Cover the body with natron salt. Leave it to dry for 40 days



5 After the 40 days, remove the natron and pack the body with straw, dried grass and linen.

> Apply make up, fake eyes and hair to make it look nice.

7 Wrap the body in linen fabric, adding amulets and a Book of the Dead.

> Finally, place the mummy in a sarcophagus and move to the pyramid.

TUTANKHAMUN

King Tutankhamun (King Tut for short!) became ruler of Ancient Egypt when he was just nine years old. The Boy King died just ten years later and he was buried in a golden coffin surrounded by 5,000 priceless treasures, including animal statues, jewellery, clothes, weapons and even toys. Some Egyptologists believe King Tut may have died in a chariot crash. But the cause of his death remains a mystery today! The tomb was found by British archaeologist Howard Carter in November 1922. Howard had spent many years excavating the tombs of Egyptian kings and queens when he came across a cup etched with the name of an obscure pharaoh – Tutankhamun.

- Hieroglyphs are an ancient Egyptian way of writing that uses pictures instead of letters
- The word 'hieroglyph' means sacred (or special) carving. There are over 700 hieroglyphs.
