Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEN+D) Reforms Implementation Project for 0-25yr olds

The new Children and Families Act 2014 is now in place and will see better integrated support for children and young people with special educational needs and disability across Education, Health and Social Care for 0 – 25 year olds. We anticipate the new Code of Practice, which will lay out the legislative duty, is due to be published Nationally this June

The Revised Code has been published – link below - has not been laid before Parliament. We are told the legal line for schools and settings is that the core aspects relating them in the new guidance will not change from this point.

Regulations are being laid before Parliament after the Easter recess, Personal Budgets regulations have already gone in. It is anticipated that once all the regulations are through, then the revised Code will be brought before the House of Commons to receive affirmative resolution. The DfE are operating within the legal timeframe for schools and settings requiring at least a terms notice to enable the revised Code to be applied from 1 September - this is largely owing to the core sections applicable to schools and settings will not change and as such this is acceptable to offer a revised Code at this stage

There is to be a final Consultation first; this brief consultation has to be responded to by 6th May

New arrangements for SEND Pathfinder support

Leicester City and Nottinghamshire County Councils have been appointed to the Pathfinder Champion role for the financial year 2014-15. Their joint role is to co-ordinate support with us from other partners, including Early Support and Preparing for Adulthood, amongst other delivery partners and offers

There have been dates arranged for our Pathfinder champions to visit Lincolnshire to offer support in various areas including EHC Plans and Process, Person Centred Planning, Joint Commissioning, Strategic Collaboration, Advocacy and Mediation.

Children and Young People and Parent Engagement

Online surveys have been prepared for completion by Children and Young People and parents/carers to tell us about their journey, what works, what doesn't and suggestions going forward. Certificates of thanks are available for taking part in the survey. A separately focused activity will take place for the Draft EHC Plan. Also a support pack has been put together to promote co-production of the Local Offer and Transitions work streams.

All these activities will all be cascaded through educational settings, the Project's Stakeholder Group and the Project's wider distribution group early May.

Action for Children and the Shadow Transition Board are preparing countywide events for Children and Young People aged 16+. There will be gift vouchers for those taking part in these events.

The locality county wide events are continuing until end July, where we are encouraging families to be part of these developments and changes – please see Flyer No 6 below. You do need to book a place for these sessions as it may be necessary to cancel if there are not sufficient numbers booked. The sessions are a mix between information sharing and updates, but most importantly an opportunity for everyone to share their experiences and make suggestions to help shape new developments. There will sometimes be table-top activities to get involved in if you wish.

EHC Plan & Process update:

Members of the SENDSAP team spent a half day session Friday 25th April with colleagues from Nottinghamshire looking at their processes and how these had been adapted to fit with EHC Plan.

Co-production of the first Draft EHC Plan which the working group have pulled together will now begin – see under Children and Young People Update.

Following that activity and when the draft guidance notes and draft assessment process have been developed, there will be a first trial of the whole process.

Transitions Planning:

There has been new CEIAG statutory guidance released Ensuring adequate support for pupils with special educational needs or disabilities

- Schools should have high aspirations for all pupils with special educational needs (SEN) and disabilities, and support them in preparing for the next phase of education or training and beyond into adult life. Pupils with SEN or disabilities should receive **independent and impartial advice** about all of the mainstream education, training and employment opportunities on offer, regardless of their individual circumstances. They should also be given information on the full range of specialist provision that is available and the support available to help them access the provision.
- Schools should make use of the local offer published by the local authority which will set out details of SEN provision including the full range of post-16 options and support available to children and young people with SEN and disabilities to help them prepare for adulthood, including getting a job. Schools should work closely with local authorities, who have an important role to play, in particular through the provision of SEN support services and Statements of Special Educational Needs/Learning Difficulty Assessments and Education, Health and Care Plans. Where a student has an Education Health and Care Plan, all reviews of that Plan from year 9 at the latest, and onwards, must include a focus on preparing for adulthood, including employment, independent living and participation in society. Statutory guidance on the new SEN duties will be provided in a new 0-25 Code of Practice.

In addition page 8 states "Schools can retain in-house arrangements for providing advice and guidance to pupils, but these in themselves are insufficient to meet the duty. In-house support for pupils must be combined with advice and guidance from independent and external sources to meet the school's legal requirements."
